### Report: "The Death of Your Brother Faisal al-Dosari (Abu Suad al-Haili) in Afghanistan and the Story of His Biography." Dated September 12, 2008

"Allahu Akhbar... Allahu Akhbar... Allahu Akhbar... This is the journal of the martyr – as we and Allah himself considers him – Faisal al-Dosari (Abu Suad al-Haili) from the country of Kuwait. During this honored month... in which the faithful compete with each other in order to reach the highest ranks... and to get priority in all of the glory-worthy deeds... to enjoy Allah's satisfaction... and all of the eternal pleasures that accompany it. Our courageous hero, Abu Suad al-Haili (Faisal al-Dosari) has become a martyr, as we and Allah himself consider him, and we do not exonerate anyone before Allah. He has dismounted from his horse in the land of Afghanistan after a hard battle with the Americans... During the retreat by the brothers, following their completion of the specific goal of this battle, the Americans called for airborne reinforcements, so two unmanned drones arrived and dropped bombs... and our brother, Faisal al-Dosari, was killed... and along with him, some of our Afghan brothers... We ask Allah to accept them among the martyrs..."

"Our brother Abu Suad al-Haili had a mission in jihad... When he participated in jihad for the first time, he went to Bosnia-Herzegovina in order to help his brothers and sisters during the second half of the year 1994. He stayed there until the end of that year, and he went under the name 'Abu Abdelaziz.' Afterwards, he returned to Kuwait, and didn't stay there for more than a few months. Later, he traveled with his heart and body to Afghanistan in order to help the Muslims there. It was there when he joined our brother Abu Muaz al-Husti, may Allah accept him, under the leadership of [Gulbuddin] Hekmatyar. He was then wounded in his head in an attack by the Shiites in Afghanistan, may Allah curse them. His head was cracked open, and he suffered slight memory loss. He was treated there for a while and then returned to Kuwait under the orders of Abu Muaz al-Husti. Following his return to Kuwait and the slight memory loss, he returned to a state of weakness."

"The days continued to pass, until the events inside Kuwait suddenly erupted. Even though he had never met them before, he set forth in order to help his brothers there. He heard that they had been placed under siege and that they wanted to fight the Americans. So, he went to the site of the siege and aided his brothers, and supported them. This is the nature of the brave believer whom we ask Allah to accept. He aided his brothers, and then disappeared from view. Once again, he began mixing with the unfaithful and once again fell into a state of weakness. Not long afterwards, after hearing inciting sermons and the propaganda of the leaders of this nation, his belief re-awakened, and he freed himself from Satan. He thereupon immigrated to Afghanistan one more time. He had just arrived and the brothers gave him command over one of the units after they made his acquaintance due to his military experience... Indeed, this is the

day our champion is walking and coming unexpectedly... We ask Allah to accept him. Behind (us) our wounds are bleeding, but ahead of us, the blood is flowing... ”

“We say to the Muslims that our Islamic nation is a nation of fertility. If one of our leaders passes away, there will rise another leader in his place... This is the way... and the passing of the martyrs will never dissuade us from it. This is the victory which has been asked for, for which hardships have been borne, and which has been searched for sorrowfully from land to land... and indeed they have achieved it...”
